I can only speak for myself, but I rate this as one of my Top 5 Golf accomplishments in my life. Did I play well, no. Did I finish, yes.

To the guys that finished, I have never seen a happier bunch. As if we won the Super Bowl. Robbie Viebrock was egging Ray Cheung to do a replay. How Teddy Manley, Greg Schrudder, and Steve Grippi shot the scores they did in that weather is AMAZING!!!! Great job Gents!!!!

Again, let’s have fun with this and be creative.

We are currently in our 2025 Membership drive. We have kept the cost down - \$90 for renewal and \$100 for new Membership. We believe with the portfolio of Tournaments, Special Events, Team Match Play, Quarterly Meetings/Dinner, and the Ancil Hoffman Golf Course (our index travels well) offers a FANTASTIC Golf Value. \$25 in 2025. Both Tournament Directors are going to increase the Tournament fees from \$20 to \$25 for the upcoming year. That will include the \$1 Hole-in-One fee that 99% of everyone pays anyway so for most of us the fee only goes up \$4. All this money is paid out to the players winnings for each Tournaments. This seems to be competitive compared to what other Clubs are charging.

LOGO CONTEST... We have had well over 100 votes and out of the 16 logo’s all of them got votes but it appears to be a two Horse race. If you haven’t voted yet, go to the website and Vote. Chuck Ashen and I will announce the winner sometime before the New Year.

Lastly, in terms of accomplishments, we are averaging about 4 Hours and forty Minutes for our Tournaments. GREAT JOB!!!! Doug Olsen and Pat Harrold have done a TREMENDOUS Job Managing our Tournaments and also promoting Pace-of-Play. The Membership Players have really taken this to heart and stepped up to make this happen.

From the Weekday Tournament Director—Doug Olson

Hello all:

In a few days, I will be posting the entry form and tournament rules for the first tournament in 2025, scheduled for January 9, so please note changes that will apply for all AHGC tournaments.

The tournament fee for all AHGC tournaments will increase from the current \$20 to \$25. It's been over a decade since the last increase, when the green fees were half the current prices, so well past due. The payouts will increase accordingly, about 25% higher.

We will no longer collect the \$1 hole in one insurance for every tournament. Since we have compiled a sufficient amount of funds to form a pool, we will pay \$1,500 each for confirmed hole in ones for all participants in AHGC tournaments. So, the net effect to the member is actually an increase of \$4 out of pocket expenses.

I want to share that the AHGC board decided not to increase annual dues for 2025, despite steep increases in our food & beverage costs from the quarterly meetings. We will be working hard trying to reduce these costs, but a nominal increase in the dues for 2026 may be unavoidable.

So, whereas green fees are likely to increase in the coming years, I don't see any further increase in tournament costs for many years. Ancil points, Gross skins, and net skins will stay at \$5, and the tournament fee will stay at \$25.

I'm also attaching the updated schedule for Midweek and Humpday Tournaments in 2025. No changes to the Midweek Schedule from 2024, but there are a few enhancements to the Humpday Schedule. First, the Wayne Parsell Senior Net Championship will be played in two consecutive days, including April 23 from white tees and April 24 from combo tees. Second, the May 21 tournament will be the member's choice of white or black tees. Third, the Two-Person Match Play Championship is back as a keeper, kicking off October 22, perhaps expanding to a third bracket. Additionally, I will be introducing a Spring Match Play League (for individual play), wherein each player is assigned to a pod of six similarly handicapped players, playing the first match on February 26, then arranging their own matches with the other four players within an overall schedule through the months of March and April (ending early May). Stay tuned, I'll send out an invite in January.

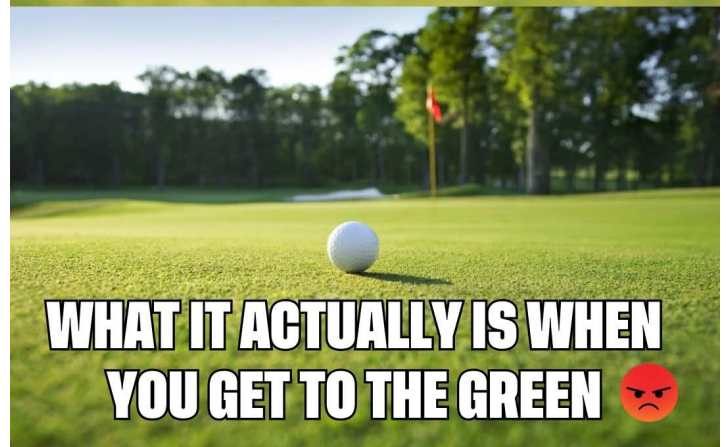

Make sure to put your GHIN number in the comment section of the payment.

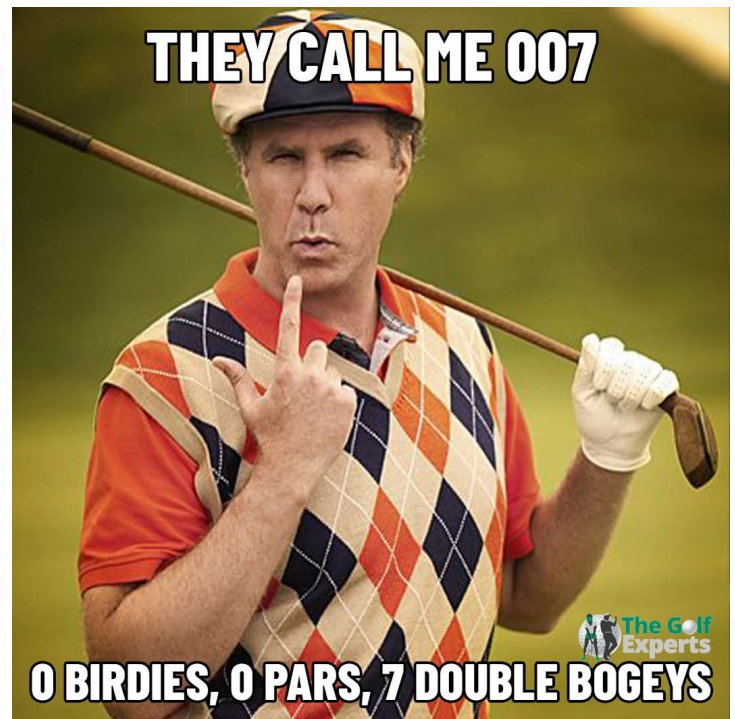
Or you may also drop a check into the Membership Box at the Ancil Hoffman Pro Shop. Again, make sure your GHIN is listed on the check.

Keith Okasaki's Interview

The interview for this edition of the Flagstick is Keith Okasaki. Keith is a previous Ancil Hoffman Golf Club (AHGC) Champion and the current AHGC Putting Champion. Keith is also the founder and team captain of the Ancil Hoffman Scratch League team. If you have played in any of the tournaments at Ancil in the last few years then you have probably seen his name on the leaderboard, or maybe you were paired with him during a Wiley outing. Either way, Keith has established himself as a skilled and competitive golfer whose story is still being written in the AHGC history book. I'm sure that his name will be on the AHGC trophies a few more times before he is done.

Moose: Where were you born? Do you have any siblings? Where do you fit in?

Keith: Only child born and raised in Sacramento and went to Kennedy High.

Moose: Did you have any pets growing up and do you have any now?

Keith: Technically, I had a cat in high school who adopted us because my dad fed a stray and it decided to not leave the backyard for 4 years. We've had a pet rabbit since 2019.

Moose: What hobbies did you do while growing up? Do you still do any of them?

Keith: Just played a lot of sports but my main hobby now is cooking.

Moose: Did you play sports growing up? If so, what was your favorite?

Keith: I played 7 years of baseball, 9 years of soccer, and 10+ years of basketball. I think baseball was my favorite early but switched to golf as I got older. I've had a bit more success on the golf course.

Moose: What college did you attend?

Keith: UC San Diego

Moose: Did you play any sports there?

Keith: I was fortunate to play golf all four years and then was the assistant coach for two after I finished playing. Free golf and stuff was hard to give up.

Moose: What was your first job?

Keith: I worked part-time on the maintenance crew at Wildhorse in Davis, starting senior year of high school and through college summers to get that free golf. I'd work my 5-1:30 shift and then practice/play until it was time to go home for dinner.

Moose: When did you get interested in playing golf?

Keith: I started going to the range with my dad around 4 years old and used to spend a lot of time at the golf course with my dad and grandfather. Played my first 18 hole rounds at 7 years old at Lighthouse and Bing Maloney, and I remember shooting 133 at each. From there, I was hooked.

Moose: When did you first play a round at Ancil Hoffman?

Keith: Hard to say. I'm guessing in the county junior tournament around 2004 and probably shot the moon.

Moose: What was the first tournament anywhere that you participated in? First tournament that you won?

Keith: I started playing Little Linkers at Bing Maloney E9 and Land Park around 8 years old, where I first met and started playing with Joell Coloma. I was fortunate to win my share of junior tournaments, but the first notable win was the 2010 NCGA Valley Amateur at Morgan Creek.

Moose: What is your lowest score at Ancil Hoffman? Lowest score anywhere?

Keith: At Ancil, I have a handful each of 67s from the golds and 66s from the blues, and a 65 from the combos. Lowest to par are a 61 at Wildhawk (although from short tees) and a 63 at Wolf Creek in Mesquite.



Moose: For what in life do you feel most grateful?

Keith: Definitely my wife for all she does, including allowing me to play as much golf as I do.

Moose: I heard that you started the Scratch League team. Why did you decide to start this team?

Keith: We have a great club with a lot of good players and it's another chance to compete against good players and friends in a fun team format.

Moose: How long has this team been around?

Keith: Our first year was 2021, so this was our fourth year. We made the NCGA finals the first two years but missed out last year.

Moose: How has this year's team been performing?

Keith: This year was amazing. We rolled through our group play with Whitney Oaks and Empire Ranch and took on Sunnyside CC, Butte Creek CC, and Lone Tree on a cold and very windy day at Poppy Hills. The team grinded for every point and was enough to tie Lone Tree for the win and to force a sudden death playoff. We advanced and played at Soboba Springs against Brookside (Pasadena), Rancho Santa Fe Farms, and Green Valley CC for the state title. We didn't play well and finished 3rd, but it was a great trip with the boys and I'm proud of our fight.

Moose: How many players are on the team? How many of them play in a match?

Keith: There's no limit to the number of players on a team but only 7 play in each match. This year, we had 10 people who played in at least 1 match. For Scratch League, clubs are paired in groups of 3 or 4, and one match is played at each course with all clubs present. In pods of 3, one player from each team is in each group and the game is 9-point. In pods of 4, the game is 16-point.

Moose: How do you decide who will play in the next match?

Keith: This is always a difficult decision since the club has so many good players who can contribute to the team. Unlike net team match play, players don't have to play in the regular season to be eligible for playoffs. We try to involve as many people as possible but will always play the best available players since scoring for the season is cumulative and 1 point can make all the difference. Of course, we try to put players on courses that fit their game. Guys like Al Estrada and Tony Potter play well at courses like Whitney Oaks, and Drew Robbins excels anywhere his length can be a weapon. Setting a lineup is always a tough task.

Moose: How can someone join the team? What kind of commitment is needed?

Keith: The teams we play against are all made of guys who play tournament golf and to compete, we are no different. The team from Lone Tree that we beat at the NCGA finals this year had the two previous NCGA players of the year and was basically an NCGA Cup Team. We are always looking for new players and the best way to be noticed is to perform well in amateur events.

Moose: This year's team made it to the finals for the State title, what is the farthest the team made in the playoffs in previous years?

Keith: We've made the NCGA finals in 2 of the 3 previous years, but were never able to advance. This was the best team we've had so far and will look to continue to improve.

Moose: Do you have any fond memories or great stories from playing in the Scratch League?

Keith: Two of the best moments were sudden death playoffs. In 2021, Juan Gonzalez and I went to a playoff against Whitney Oaks. Juan birdied the first hole at Whitney to get us to the playoffs in our first year. This year at Poppy Hills, we sent Domingo Jojola and Marc Engellenner, our two new stud recruits, to a playoff against Lone Tree for the NCGA title. Domingo made a 12-footer on 1 to extend the playoff, and Marc hit an 8iron on 2 from 195 and made the 14-footer essentially for the win. The trophy is currently displayed in the Ancil pro shop. While winning is great, each match we battle and grind against the other teams and drink beer with them afterwards since we know the other teams well. This league is a lot of fun!

Moose: What is up next for your team?

Keith: The Scratch League season doesn't start up again until September. We will look to continue to build and improve our team and represent Ancil the best we can. I appreciate all the support we've received from the club.

Keith, thank you very much for sharing your story with us all. Good luck with the Scratch League team next year! I know that we are all eager to see what you will accomplish in your golfing future.

Green Valley CC moved on through Flight 1, winning with a score of 28 points. Second place went to Corral de Tierra CC with 19 points.

In Flight 2 action, Ancil Hoffman GC took the title after knocking off Lone Tree GC in a playoff after both teams finished regulation tied at 37.

The event uses a format that incorporates Stableford scoring, match play and stroke play.

Both Green Valley CC and Ancil Hoffman GC advanced to the California Player's League Championship, set for Dec. 5 at Soboba Springs in Hemet, where they face the two best squads from SoCal.
